Course Objectives of mentioned courses: Child Rights Convention (CRC):



Course Goal

To increase the level of understanding & realization capacity of the participants on UNCRC and developed their capacity to duty bearers accountability and the role of different in upholding the rights of children.

Specific objectives of CRC Training:

- To conceptualize the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child
- To increase awareness among the participants of a child's need by recalling individual childhood memories.
- To differentiate critically between needs and rights.
- To get into the concepts of participation & child participation.
- To find out which group is being discriminated, by whom, how is discrimination being done and finally, why.
- To define accountability and the role of different duty bearers in upholding the rights of children.
- Identify individual's own, social and professional viewpoints and roles & responsibilities to help implementation of child rights.

Training Methodology

Participatory training methods and techniques will be used in facilitating the session are as follows:

- Interactive lectures
- Group work
- Interactive discussion
- Experience sharing
- Practical observation
- Case study
- Question-answer
- Group discussions/exercises
